ASH WEDNESDAY – February 14



Lent is quickly approaching. Our Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday is **9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.** If you would like to bring ashes to a family

member or friend who is homebound, please see our Sacristan Sandra. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence for all healthy Catholics ages 18-59 inclusive.

SAINT VALENTINE LENT LOVE TRIBUTE.

February 14 is known throughout the world as the day dedicated to flowers and chocolates, red hearts and candies, chubby cherubs, and arrows. Couples, especially young ones eagerly look forward to a night out or otherwise romantic getaway on that special day.

This year St. Valentine's Day happens on Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, which is a day of fasting and abstinence with limited food and entertainment. This year let us bring our loved ones to Jesus and offer them our prayer for the whole Lent and every day indeed. You can write your loved person's name on a heart shape poster that will be displayed for the whole Lent in our church sanctuary. The poster is waiting for you in the church lobby.

HOLY LENT

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. (www.usccb.org)

LENT FASTING DEMANDS

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. (www.usccb.org)

LENTEN "NUGGETS" (reflections)

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus's passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary, usually through sacred art, prayers, and reflections. The practice began as pious

pilgrims traced his path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa.

Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the fourteen stations currently found in almost every church throughout the world.

Parish Ministries and Groups will lead our Way of the Cross every Friday of Lent at 7 pm. Join us in prayer.

Each year the Church gives us six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since most of us find that we've wandered from God's path, Lent becomes that second chance, or do-over, to "return to God with our whole heart." 20-mins Lenten Reflection on Tuesday at 6:30 pm before Holy Mass. Our Tuesday topics: 1. Charity. 2. Sunday. 3. Penance 4. Purgatory. 5. Pope. 6. Heaven. There will be a possibility to submit questions. Perhaps these extra minutes that you can spare for reflection and prayer during Lent will change your life, sanctify you and secure you a safe path to eternity. It will cost you a little but in exchange you will taste heaven.

DAY OF PRAYER FOR SURVIVORS AND VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ABUSE

The Second Sunday of Lent, February 25, 2024, is the annual Day of Prayer for Survivors and Victims of Sexual Abuse in the Diocese of Hamilton. The Vatican document states: "In the experience of our members, victims/survivors have often expressed a desire for prayer as an important element in their healing process." In invited **Bishops** response, Pope Francis worldwide to establish a special day of prayer in the Church year to support the paths of human and spiritual recovery. This day is designed not only for victims and survivors who have been so severely injured, either inside or outside the Church, but also for families and communities affected by grief for their loved ones. A special prayer intention for healing will be added to all Sunday Masses on February 25. "We pray for

people who have been abused, whether physically, mentally, emotionally, or sexually, that the Lord of all tenderness and compassion will restore them and give them peace. Amen"
