



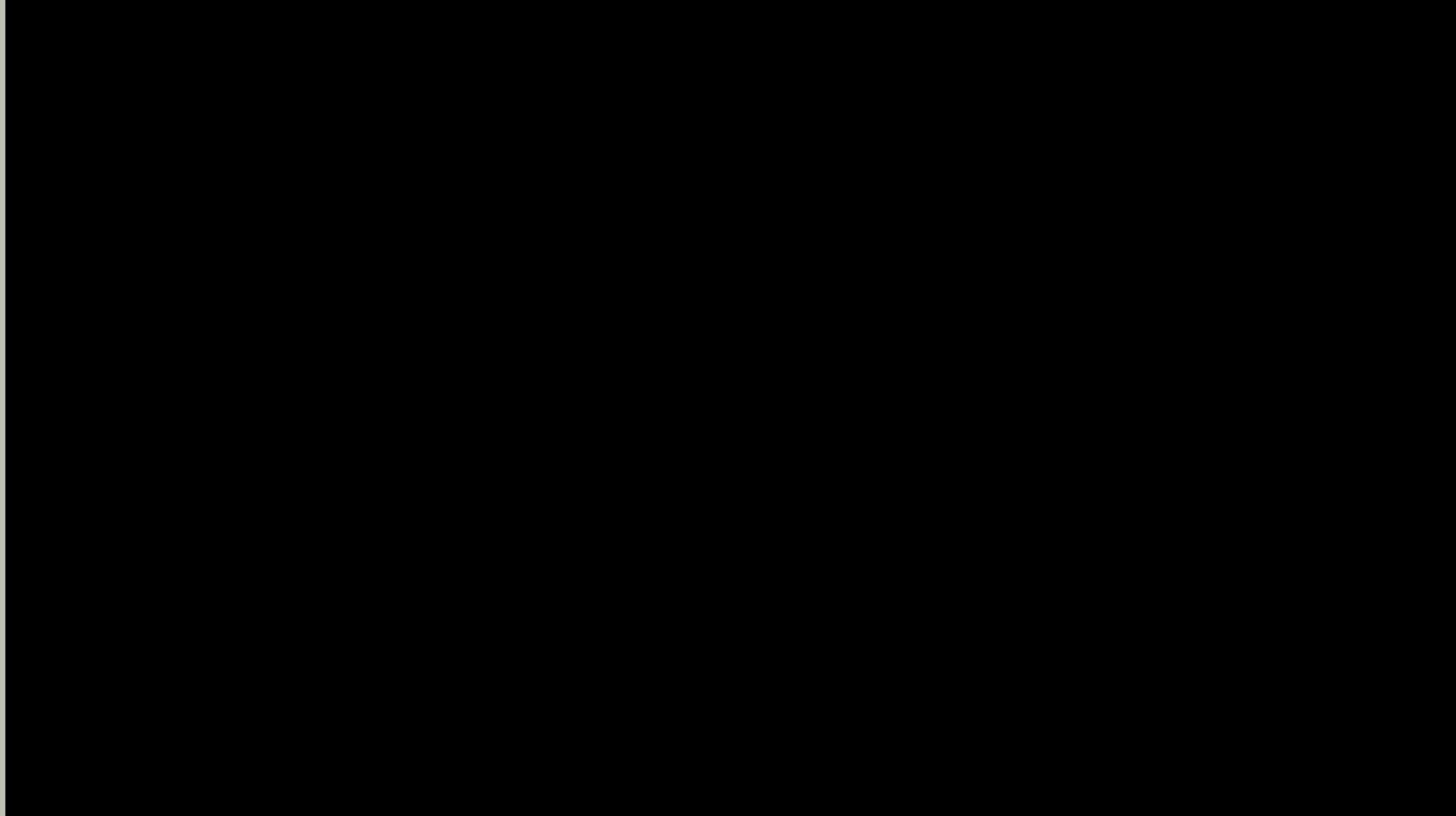

NEW Updates for Ministers (A)

Entrance Procession,

Bow or genuflect and proceed; do not wait for the priest.

Ring again when the Tabernacle is closed.

Setting Up the Altar:

If there are two or more acolytes, following the Petitions, at the start of the offertory hymn, bring the following to the altar:

Chalice, Missal, Ciborium (if needed).

If there is one acolyte, the items are set on the altar beforehand.

Wine and Water.

Wine and water are brought in the offertory procession without the tray when there are two acolytes and on the tray when there is one acolyte. After receiving wine and water, proceed to the altar, not side credence.

Return to the side credence and serve the water and towel to the priest immediately.



NEW Updates for Ministers (B)

Bells (once):

Ring before the proclamation, *"This is the Lamb of God."*

Communion Paten Use:

Follow closely with the paten beneath the hands of the priest or minister.

Ensure the host is protected and prevent it from falling.

Bells (once):

Ring again when the Tabernacle is closed
