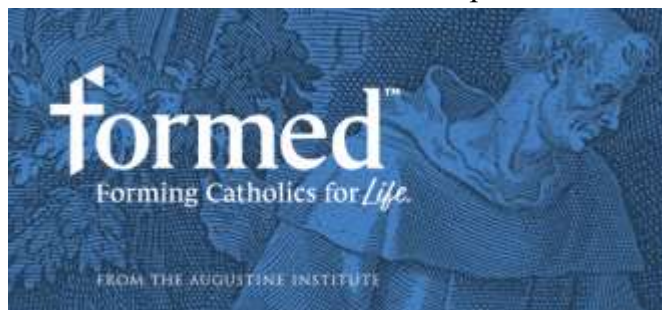

HOURS OF OPERATION

The church will **open 30 minutes before the first Mass** on Sunday and weekdays. These changes will begin on November 4th. Afternoon and evening parish activities will not be affected.

BLESSED SACRAMENT MONTHLY FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

We are inviting you to sign up as a permanent adorer (if you are not currently signed up) to commit to one particular hour each First Friday of the month. Perhaps you may wish to ask a family member or friend to join you. Ideally, it would be good to have at least two people, if not three or four, permanently assigned to each hour. Each month, a reminder e-mail will be sent to you about a week before. If it happens that you cannot attend your hour, then you could either switch with someone on the list, or ask someone else to take your place. Then, you can reply to my reminder e-mail to let me know if you have a replacement or to just stroke your name off the list.

Please complete one of the little sign-up forms, available on the Lost & Found table, indicating the hour, your name, phone number and e-mail address.

The regular monthly sign-up sheet will still be available for those who can only sign up in the days preceding the First Friday.
